Applicants with a bachelor's degree, as well as people with a higher professional education, confirmed by the assignment of the qualification "certified specialist", have the right to participate in the competition for places funded from the budget allocations of the federal budget. PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The main learning activities are lectures and practical classes. There are practical trainings and research work in each semester. Master's students are offered 8 elective courses.

The 1st year is aimed at obtaining the basic knowledge in the following subjects: "Methodology of culture studies", "Main problems of modern cultural policy", "Modern studies of culture in Russia", "Modern techniques of culture texts analysis", "European projects of university education", "Professional foreign language" and others. In their first year students acquire practical skills in research and teaching activities.

The second year is aimed at obtaining advanced professional knowledge in the following subjects: "Basic problems of sociology and culture", "Methods of teaching cultural studies", "Culture of mass communication", "Phenomenon of language in philosophical and cultural thought of Western Europe" and others.

The fourth semester includes teaching internship and research work. In the last year students are focused on the writing of the master's thesis.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Masters graduates are prepared to work in research institutions and institutions of higher and secondary special education. Graduates can continue their postgraduate studies.
